Subject: Meeting of Content and Application Providers dated 29th August 2012. – Minutes Regarding

Participation:

- a) Officers from DoT and TEC.
- b) Representative of Content and Application Providers

Proceedings:

Shri R M Agarwal DDG (NT) welcomed all the participants in the 6th meeting of the Content & application providers and said that as far as IPv6 implementation is concerned, a lot of developments have taken place across the stack holders. Government released IPv6 Deployment Roadmap version -1 in July 2010. On pan India basis, Major Service providers are ready for IPv6 services. To make complete ecosystem to be ready, Content and Application also need to migrate on IPv6 platform. He explained that it is planned to release the National IPv6 Deployment Roadmap V-2 at the time of India Telecom Event.

2. Shri R K Bhatnager, Advisor (T) said that Government is very keen on IPv6 implementation and IPv6 is part of NTP-2012. As far as IPv6 implementation is concerned, Six Service Providers are ready. State/UT and Central Government Departments are also working in this direction. After first version of the Roadmap release, Government is releasing National IPv6 deployment Roadmap version -2 with finer details. Some of the websites are on dual stack. Development among Content Providers is yet to take pace. Some of the websites have migrated to dual stack. Newsletters are also available on DoT websites. There is need from Service Providers side to highlight the benefit of IPv6 among other stakeholders. Activity Sheet is framed considering issues in IPv6 migration. Workshops are proposed for concerned officers of Organisations in Dept. of Finance Services, Gol in coming days.

3. Shri Raman Chima, Sr Policy Analyst, Google India said that on world IPv6 Launch day on 6th June 2012, no major problem was reported. Already major websites like Google, Yahoo, FB etc have migrated to dual stack. There are several tools with regard to IPv6 on the Ipv6 google website. We are also keen to help out those facing problem in migrating to Ipv6.

4. Shri S K R C Prasad, Vice President, Axis Bank said that the bank is yet to start this activity and it need to consult the Service Providers. Also the bank is yet to receive directive from RBI.

DDG (NT) said that we will write to RBI for necessary guideline.

5. Shri Khizer Hussian and Shri Pawan Chawla of Yatra online said that they are evaluating Service Providers implementation and potential proliferations. Gateways need to be ready. CDN's are major building block. Their network Equipments are ready and Dec 2012 is targeted for migration on dual stack.

6. Sri Rishi Jha and Vivek Singh of Handygo Tech Pvt Ltd said that Service Providers have not confirmed them about IPv6 migration. They are concentrating on Mobile space and need to go with migration of IPv6 of Handsets and after knowing the potential and requirement of IPv6, they will definitely move towards migration of the same. They have installed their services at the ISP's premises and need to so will discuss with ISP for dual stack working at earliest.
