In this regard, the Programme Committee of UNWDF has opened the call for Programme Proposals for inclusion in the UNWDF 2024 programme and the last date for submitting proposals to the Committee is **12 January 2024**. ## CALL FOR PROGRAMME PROPOSALS

# Introduction

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On behalf the Programme Committee (<https://unstats.un.org/unsd/undataforum/partners/programme-committee.html>) for the UN World Data Forum to be held in Medellín, Colombia between 11 and 14 November 2024 (UNWDF 2024) and the UN Statistical Commission's High-level Group for Partnership, Coordination and Capacity-Building (<https://unstats.un.org/sdgs/hlg/>) for statistics for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (HLG-PCCB), we are pleased to announce the opening of the **Call for Programme Proposals**.

The aim of the UN World Data Forum is to spur data innovation, nurture partnerships, mobilize high-level political and financial support for data, and build a pathway to better data for sustainable development. Since the first Forum (<https://unstats.un.org/unsd/undataforum/capetown-2017/>) in January 2017, the audience for the Forum has grown from 2,000 people to active stakeholder group of over 20,000. The UNWDF 2024 will bring together data leaders from diverse range of stakeholders such as governments, civil society, the private sector, donor and philanthropic bodies, international and regional agencies, the geospatial community, the media, academia (including students), and professional bodies; to exchange ideas, showcase innovations, identify solutions, discuss future strategies, and provide mutual learning opportunities on a wide variety of topics organized across four Thematic Areas of the Forum (<https://unstats.un.org/unsd/undataforum/programme/>).

## Scope of programme proposals

The Programme Committee aims to have imaginative programme proposals that address issues of interest to our broad community, incorporate innovative approaches to data and statistics and include concrete recommendations or announce new initiatives. Over the course of the three-day Forum, there will be opportunities to engage in a programme that focuses on the opportunities and challenges in data production and use in a changing data landscape and sharing ideas for solutions and strategies for the way forward.

We welcome proposals that cover a full-length session<sup>1</sup>, shortened session<sup>2</sup> or feature as a special format<sup>3</sup> in the programme. As in previous years, the Programme Committee welcomes full session proposals that demonstrate collaboration and joint work among a mixed group of data communities but this year, the Programme Committee are also interested in receiving more specialised proposals from the wider user and producer community to feature on the programme as sessions or appear in a special format.

This will be an in-person event to enable more creative formats and ensure high levels of engagement and networking at the venue. Only by special exception will any virtual or hybrid mode of delivery be permitted. Due to the limited capacity at the venue and expected number of submissions, not all proposals will be accepted. There will be approximately seventy 60-minute time slots in the programme to accommodate either full-length sessions or combinations of shortened sessions and special event proposals. The Programme Committee also makes significant efforts to request proposals with complimentary content and/or with the similar speakers are combined or at least matched with a stronger proposal. This means that potentially more than 70 session proposals can be accepted from the call. The number of special format proposals accepted will depend on the type of proposals received and the logistical capacity to accommodate them in the programme.

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<sup>1</sup> Full-length sessions are usually 60 minutes in duration with between 4 and 6 speakers, including moderators/ facilitators.

<sup>2</sup> Shortened sessions can be a 20-minute ignite/lightning talk with a single speaker on an issue which the Programme Committee can try and match with another full-length session or combine shortened sessions to make a full-length session.

<sup>3</sup> Special formats being considered are for press-style announcements, activity areas with interactive events like workshops and demonstration areas to show the latest data solutions.

## Proposal selection criteria

Proposals will be evaluated by the Programme Committee against a set of criteria to ensure that there is a balance across the Thematic Areas, a wide range of topics are covered and different formats are offered under each area.

1. **Relevance and impact** – the proposal is aligned with the specific topics requested and contributes to the overall objectives of the Forum
2. **Data Innovation showing a fresh approach** – the proposal presents innovative ideas through the combined use of data sources, methods and partnerships
3. **Demonstrates concrete and practical experiences** – the proposal showcases and discusses concrete experiences with data production and data use and offers concrete recommendations or the launch of new initiatives and partnerships.

**For full-length session proposals**, the following additional criteria are considered

4. **Creativity in format** – creative session designs are encouraged besides panel discussions to foster better engagement/interaction with the audience and for the Forum to be as participatory as possible.
5. **Diversity of speakers** – a mix of data communities, different geographical regions and balanced gender representation is required among the speakers, presenters and moderators; where an emphasis on engagement with policy makers and the inclusion of high-level speakers will be considered an asset.

## Terms and conditions

Decisions about the inclusion of a proposal in the UNWDF 2024 programme will be based

on its content and composition assessed against the evaluation criteria, described above, while also ensuring a balance across the programme in terms of topics, formats and speaker representation. Initial acceptance decisions will be communicated based on the Programme Committee's evaluation. Final decisions will be made once the finalized proposal details are submitted and the final programme is approved by the UN Statistical Commission's High-level Group for Partnership, Coordination and Capacity-Building for statistics for the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development (HLG-PCCB) (<https://unstats.un.org/unsd/undataforum/partners/HLG-PCCB.html>).

In the initial acceptance decision, the Programme Committee or the HLG-PCCB may request revisions to the proposal or have proposals with similar content and/or with the same speakers be combined or at least matched with a stronger proposal. These revised proposals are subject to the approval of the Programme Committee and/or HLG-PCCB. Following final acceptance, if significant changes are made to the proposals, the Programme Committee and/or HLG-PCCB reserve the right to cancel sessions. While creative formats of delivery are encouraged to ensure that the Forum is as participatory and interactive as possible, the venue might not be able to accommodate all proposed formats, or, in case they require particular logistical arrangements, they can only be accommodated at the organisers own cost.

As an organiser whose proposal is selected, you will be responsible for:

- conducting your event within the appropriate time slot, based on Medellín local time, given by the Forum organisers
- adhering to all guidance shared by the Forum organisers and responding to any information requests from them in a timely manner
- ensuring good communication with all persons featuring in your event that they will attend in-person thereby registering for the Forum by the deadline and prepared to make their own travel and accommodation arrangements (as applicable)
- ensuring responsibility for the organization and logistical support of a compatible virtual meeting platform for any persons who will appear in your event virtually

## BACKGROUND

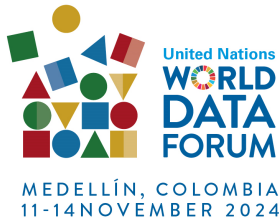

A polling feature could also be used to engage with the audience, subject to availability in the online event platform. The moderator will summarize the key points from the discussion at the end.
<b>Full-length session format 2:</b> open format (please specify details)	This format consists of any non-panel open discussion format where in 60 minutes the audience participation takes up more than two-thirds of the time and this participation is encouraged by sub-dividing the audience or arranging them into smaller groups such as in a beehive or fishbowl format or holding bilateral conversations. <b>Shortened session:</b> Ignite/lightning talks or other (please specify details)	This format consists of a SINGLE speaker giving a short talk for up to 20 minutes on a key idea or topic. They can be announcements or press style launch and can include book readings by authors, short presentations on newly released reports and static demonstrations of knowledge sharing platforms.
<b>Special format 2:</b> interactive learning activity	This format will be conducted for up to 60 minutes in a dedicated area of the Forum venue with a limited capacity participation in workshops, data labs or competitions to promote new skills or offer collaboration on a new data initiative. These activities will be facilitated by organizers based on a set of presentations and/or training modules and hands-on exercises and participants would bring their own devices as appropriate to fully participate. The format can include participants voting on preferred solutions or use of a panel of judges. This format may require the provision of some funds from a specific entity.
<b>Special format 3:</b>	This format will be conducted for between 20 and 30 minutes in a dedicated area

demonstration or interactive exhibit	of the Forum venue and may be grouped within a time slot with others of the same format. They can be demonstrations of data visualizations or show other audio-visual displays such as a short film or documentary on data use and innovation to transform lives. These displays should be a creative combination of art, data science and storytelling while also functional and able to communicate important data or information clearly and effectively to the audience. They can be an outcome of a documentary competition organized and concluded prior to the Forum.

The CTGAP currently contains 6 strategic areas, 14 objectives and 66 key actions. The UN General Assembly welcomed the document in its resolution (A/RES/71/313) on 7 July 2017. Its objectives can be summarized as: Strengthen coordination within and between national, regional and international statistical and data systems; Develop and strengthen partnerships between statistical systems and the wider data ecosystem; Modernize data governance, standards and institutional frameworks to meet user needs; Facilitate the application of new technologies, geospatial information and data into statistics; Strengthen and expand data on all groups of the population to ensure that no one is left behind; Develop and promote innovative strategies for improved dissemination and use of data; Ensure that resources are available to implement the necessary programmes and activities.
